Strategy Summary

Early Years & Key Stage One

- Investment in key reading areas
- Investment in RWI/pre reading books for EYFS.
- Online reading scheme to ensure books continued to be matched to pupil's phonics sounds even in lockdown.

Key Stage Two

- Reintroduce and retrain staff on Fresh Start
- Investment in Fresh Start Materials
- Additional TA to support with reading interventions across the Key Stage
- Online reading scheme to ensure books continued to be matched to pupil's reading levels even in lockdown.

Impact Headlines April 2021

- 91% of pupils passed the Year Two Phonics Screening Check in December 2020
- Despite school closures, the school is set to meet the aspirational target of 93% pupils passing the phonics assessment.

Impact Headlines July 2021

- 91% of Pupils passed the Year One Phonics Screening Check 2021
- 86% of pupils are at the expected standard of green books in RWI by the end of the academic year 2021.
- All children have access to e-books – relating to their RWI and reading level
